Most of the members who brought their modules to the Memorial Day setup left them through Tuesday. Gil Brauch served as Dispatcher, Engineer, Road Foreman of Engines, and General Superintendent as he gave the children a tour of the layout and "ran trains" for them. Matt Schaefer gave a helping hand and did some photo documentation of the event. Chester Freedenthal's Bullet Train was the hit of the event as it rocketed around and around the Red Line, easily overtaking Robert Buden's Mallet and it's coal drag on Blue (which also performed magnificently). Gil's venerable ConCor E-8 lugged the Southern Crescent in an opposing direction on Yellow, providing a bit of contrast. On the Mountain Division was the NVNTRAK Yellow Train, of course, complete with the "Club Car".

By the end of the day, about 300 children had visited the layout in groups of 10 or 12. "The first six classes or so were really fun!", said Gil. "But by the time the afternoon classes started coming through I was all "Trained Out!" By all reports, students and teachers alike were thoroughly entertained by the display. Education was also a part of it, though. Each tour ended at the operating crossing flashers on Leonard White's Ice Block Junction module with a talk about "Stop, Look, and Listen" and staying off the railroad tracks.

Thanks go to Gil, Matt, Robert, Chester, Leonard, Edd Braithwood, Lyman Krekel, Keith Holzapfel, Rodney Smith, Peter Matthews, and Charles Greenacre for the loan of their modules and trains for the event.

In addition, the designer will receive the first car produced free.

What are the rules you may ask. They are really very simple.

- Entries will be accepted from NVNTRAK members in good standing as of 1 October 1995 and all entries become the property of the convention committee staff.
- Entries must be received no later than 31 October 1995.
- Colored entries are acceptable, but no more than four colors should be used (not counting the basic paint color on the car itself).
 Designers should bear in mind that each color used increases cost and the committee will be concerned with cost of production as a factor in judging.
- Entries must be drawn to scale, including artwork at twice the size of the finished product.
- Lines in artwork must not be narrower than 2 pt. when reduced to final form.
- Final design will be selected by the convention committee. Their decision will be final.

We have a lot of talent in the club and are looking forward to receiving some really outstanding entries. All who enter will be suitably recognized, regardless of the outcome of the judging.

Convention Corner by Rodney Smith

This month we have worked on our publicity material, sent out our first mailing to East Coast N Scale clubs, and prepared for this Summer's conventions in Albuquerque and Atlanta. Gil has put together a new tri-fold flier for the convention that we will be carrying to New Mexico and Georgia. Brian is in the process of putting together distinctive convention shirts and hats for members that will be going out on publicity trips for the convention. I am just now completing a mailing out to 53 N scale clubs East of the Mississippi and in Eastern Canada. Hopefully this will start to generate some intense interest and some more registrations. I am hopping on AMTRAK on Monday the 26th to go out to the West Coast NTRAK convention in Albuquerque. A group of us are heading down to Atlanta in mid-July to take part in the large NTRAK layout at the NMRA convention. That's the highlights for this

FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT'S HEAD SHED by Matt Schaefer

FALL CONVENTIONS - Our Mid Eastern Region, (New Jersey down through Carolina) is having the fall convention Sept 28 to Oct 1, 1995 at the Hunt Valley Mariott just north of Timonium on I-83, about a one hour drive from the Potomac River. This is commuting distance for some members. They have reserved a space for a 15' x 25' layout for our club and any one else that wants to join. The Mariott rooms are \$79. You do not have to be an NMRA member to register, only to enter the judged contests.

REGISTRATION - The MER has "the whole lower floor" and the On3 Modular Club has signed up too. Our club has sufficient interest to have a loop there and I would love to run jointly with lots of other clubs in the NE & SE Regions. The Peninsula Model RR Club and John Plant are interested. The extent of the participation of the Peninsula membership will of course depend on what breaks we get on the registration which is now under consideration by the committee. I am pushing for as large a layout as we can get.

BANTRAK is setting up the week before at the N Scale Collector Convention and does not want to set up another whole layout at the MER one week later. One featured train will be the "Heart Attack Special" made up of all high dollar collector cars. Bob Winterbottom said the Baltimore club would also like to have a joint meeting north of Baltimore with us and PA and NJ clubs. All options are open for discussion.

VOLUNTEER - Take advantage of NMRA conventions. Be sure to take all your contest Quality (top quality) items models and pictures to enter but you must be a member of the MER and NMRA to enter the NMRA judged contests. If you can, volunteer to give clinics and for other positions. And if you are going into Atlanta early the N Scale popular vote contest is open Monday 4-8PM and Tuesday 9-4PM. Winners will be announced at the breakfast Thursday. Then the NMRA contest is open to entries through Wednesday. So take your good stuff.

'96 PUBLICITY - I had two articles in Jim's N-TRAK Newsletter in May and another article in the July issue, all calling attention to the '96 Convention. We're also getting lots of press from Bob Gatland, NE Regional Director. Bob writes in his newsletter, "By the end of this summer N-TRAK will undoubtedly be a corporation... For the summer of 1996 the N-TRAK East Convention in Alexandria will get the lion's share of our attention. We won't attempt to put on a major summer event until 1997 or later..."

T MODULES - We should plan to have on hand one pair of T modules ready in case we join another club or have a larger enough layout for two loops and I know of a T called Quinnamont nearing completion as we read this. Quinamont has "flex turnouts" and other features. See sketch of Cabin Creek Jct, a variation on the T theme and a fine mate for Miss Quinnamont, 1995.

THE PENINSULA N-TRAK MODEL RR - The Peninsula Club owns 17 modules with matching scenery including a 12 set of modules with a seaport scene. Obie has seen the layout and says it looks great and they won the big money prize at the Norfolk Great American Train Show. The club just ordered a pot load of Aristo controllers.

MATCHING SCENERY - We have lots of great modules but no standards on scenery. Charles has suggested we set up OPTIONAL standards for those that want to build modules with scenery that matches other modules and I think this is a good idea. Our club policy is as long as the basic specs are met other standards are OPTIONAL like these proposed scenery standards, facia, the mountain line, etc. Comments?

ARISTO CONTROLS - These radio controls were great at the Fairfax Fair letting the operators roam. Gil confirmed my assertion that the easiest way to run 3+ trains around any loop for hours at a time is to use the 2 block system controlled by one hand controller and one person. One



person is responsible for all trains in that loop and no communication is required except in the case of a mishap. The principal is the same as the slowing block operation except the slowing block is the block that the operator can see best. If you 4 blocked a loop with radio controllers it would just add unnecessary complication to the running of 3+ trains. There are no dials and the only indicator is the speed of the trains.

SHORTS - If you're running a long train and your rear end hangs out on to another block you're apt to get some new shorts if a wheel stops on the gap and you power the blocks in opposite directions. We did have a melt down on an engine truck due to a short. The Aristo gives no indication of shorts, but indicators can be added making a nice club construction project.

MODULE OF THE YEAR

(or here is another of Schaefer's hair brained ideas!)

<u>E-8 SHOW PLACE</u> - Everybody is buying those beautiful Life Like E-8's; RF&P in the blue and gray, ACL purple and silver, also C&O, AMTRAK - not to mention B&O and PRR. But we can't run them <u>ALL</u> at the same time guys! Rod is building a large though station and here is another crazy idea for a different station if you have at least a minivan for transportation, see diagram and photo of Broad Street Station. FLEX TURNOUTS - With "flex turnouts" you can get

FLEX TURNOUTS - With "flex turnouts" you can get beautiful smooth long radius curves to enhance the long E-8's and passenger cars. The diorama is actually compressed to the left giving the best viewing and photography from the right side. The corner is similar to a modified 3x3 module. The connector tracks are kept to a minimum of 7 total between the 2 modules but the prototypical curve bows out to give 16+ car capacity on 3 tracks for the long Florida trains plus plenty of tracks for local, express and the short N&W trains. Of course with an extension module to the left the station could be more fully modeled.

CRUISING BY - I remember well cruising down Broad Street in my '50 Merc to get the best spot on the back row of the Hot Shop drive-in around 9PM so we could watch and listen to the ACL East Coast and West Coast Champion E-6's and E-8's line up side by side on the curve past the platforms. What timing. Even the N&W K's and J's were scheduled in here and later all the SAL trains. At the junk pile on the curve is where I started collecting RR lanterns. This would also be a good place to park your varnish and junk for those folks just cruising by.

'96 CONVENTION - Now is the time to let go on your set of dream modules so they can be finished to high standards in time for the '96 Convention. We are planning for a 200 registrations but our plans will be flexible enough to entertain F300, 400 or whatever. We have the facilities for whatever.

Who says you only go around once? Take N-TRAK.

Joy,

Thanks for the notice on the N scale GP-7s. Just about everyone could use a GP-7. I just bought two Atlas N scale RS-3s and they run very well.

However, I'm not so pleased with the Atlas N Scale turnouts I recently installed on my NTRAK module. In particular I am very unhappy with the electrical characteristics of these turnouts. They are allegedly supposed to be all live with insulated frog, yet two out of five that I installed were dead. It required a half hour of troubleshooting on my part to determine that there was not electrical connectivity between the moving points and the frog rails. I appears that the pivot joint does not provide a reliable electrical connection. To solve the problem required jumper wires from the stock rails to the frog.

I discussed this problem with some of my NTRAK associates and they echoed the complaint. Just about all of us have experienced this problem with Atlas turnouts.

We would all feel better if we were assured that Atlas was doing something to address this problem. In other respects the turnouts are fine considering their low cost.

Thanks for letting us know your thoughts. It is always appreciated.



June Setup


